CHARTERING IN EUROPE?

YOU WILL NEED A RECOGNISED ICC (INTERNATIONAL CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENCY)



It is now mandatory to hold a recognised International Certificate of Competency (ICC) if you wish to charter a boat in certain European and Scandinavian countries. IYT is uniquely authorised to issue ICCs on behalf of the Irish Government and the British Maritime and Coastguard Agency (MCA).

The ICC is a product of the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE) Resolution 40 and provides documentary assurance from one Government to another that the holder meets the levels of competence laid down in Resolution 40 to safely operate a pleasure boat.

The following countries have adopted Resolution 40 and officially accept the ICC as proof of boating competence within their territory:

CEVNI ENDORSEMENT: Almost all inland waterways require an ICC with CEVNI inland endorsement which is required for navigating inland waters, lakes, rivers and canals. CEVNI is the Code Europeen Des Voies De Navigation Interieure (Revision 2)



WHAT ENDORSEMENTS ARE REQUIRED FOR DIFFERENT TYPES OF VESSEL AND WATERS?

The endorsement may be:

- Power < 24m
- Power < 10m
- Sail <24m & Power <10m (for operating the tender)
- PWC personal watercraft
- Coastal Waters
- Inland Waters (CEVNI)

WHAT SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE ARE REQUIRED TO OBTAIN AN ICC?



The ICC requires both theory and practical examination. The written examination must be conducted in a recognised IYT partner school and usually takes about 1 hour. The ICC and CEVNI theory preparation course is available on-line at www.getanicc.com.

The practical examination takes place on either a power or sailboat (depending on desired endorsement) and usually takes about 2 to 3 hours.

Candidates are required to prove practical competency in boat handling skills, docking, manoeuvering in confined spaces, navigation, pilotage, weather, man overboard and vhf radio operations.

For a sail endorsement, candidates must also demonstrate competency in sail handling, tacking, jibing and sailing on and off an anchorage.
